2021 INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION NOW VIRTUAL

JUNE 25-29 2021 - LOCATION: WHEREVER YOU ARE!

Recently Lions Clubs International sent out this message in regards to the upcoming 2021 International Convention:

"Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Here are some important details about the 2021 convention we would like to share with you now:

- Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.
- The registration fee is \$75. The registration fee for Leos will be US\$30 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29. Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.
- Lions who are currently registered for convention will receive an email soon with more information about their registration options.
- Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.
- Convention updates and details will be posted here at <u>lcicon.lionsclubs.org</u> as they become available.

This global health pandemic has forced us all to make decisions and changes that place health and safety first. However, we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions, we continue to find new ways to stay connected, safely serve our communities and continue our global mission of service."

Name: Kathy Oberlin

Profession: Homemaker for about 30 years now; Used to be

software engineer for Lear Siegler/Smiths Ind.

Years as a Lion: Officially - 3 or 4 years. I feel like I've been a Lion for most of my adult life because of Mark's involvement.

Do you hold positions within the club?

• **KO:** I organize and drive for our Lions Courtesy Shopping transport service. This group of volunteers - some Lions, some not - provides transportation and assistance to the blind and visually impaired in the GR area for doctor appointments and grocery shopping. ABVI refers their clients in need to us. In addition to the ABVI referrals, we also provide transportation to a blind gentleman in Rockford that needs dialysis 3 times a week. We are collaborating with the Rockford Lions Club to provide this transportation.

What is your favorite thing about being a Lion?

• **KO:** I would have to say the opportunity for 'hands on' helping people. Mark and I have been fortunate enough to go on several mission trips with the Lions. Going to other places in the world and helping people see clearly for the first time in their lives - it's an experience we will never forget. The people we meet - fellow international Lions and patients - are so appreciative and genuine. You get the feeling you are really helping. I'm getting that same feeling with our Lions transport service. We are making a difference and truly helping.

If you were talking with someone considering being a Lion, what advice would you have to share?

• **KO:** I don't know about other Lions clubs, but our Lions club is chocked full of 'good' people. GOOD people doing GOOD things. It probably sounds a little corny but if you want to help make this world a better place, associate with GOOD people and do GOOD things. I feel like that's what Lionism is all about.

When not at Lions, what do you like to do for fun?

• **KO:** We spend a lot of time in Arizona hiking. When in Michigan - I play a lot of tennis (before Covid), pontooning on the river and being with family...and we love to travel!
