We will be in the University Club in the Devos Center, at the Pew Campus downtown. All on the west side of 131.


Parking will be at the Seward Ramp, directly west (across the open parking lot). Next to the railroad tracks.

TREASURER'S REPORT

FY 2024 Treasurer's Report

Our year ended June 30, 2024. One major change for the new fiscal year is that we have consolidated our banking relationships to Lake Michigan Credit Union. Their Treasury Department has greatly helped streamline financial operations. Whereas previously each of our two corporations banked at a different institution, we now have all banking in one place. We have had to make some changes to the way we receive some payments-if you were affected, you have been contacted already or will be soon. Going forward, we prefer credit, debit or ACH, but if checks are necessary, please remember that the Club's business address is now:

The following is a recap of the financial highlights for 2024:

The General Fund – this is the corporation through which we host our lunches and social events. Dues are billed throughout the year based on a member's status. The fund typically runs small monthly deficits. Our primary revenue is from dues and was around \$23,00 with some other small sources of income. Our primary expense is meals. Our new situation at GVSU should cost slightly less than either the Holiday Inn or the U Club. Other costs are dues paid to Lions International/Michigan; wages to the Secretary, Treasurer & Editor; some social events (like the Installation Banquet & Summer Outing) and administrative expenses like postage, accounting software, etc.

The Charities Fund - this is the corporation that sponsors our charitable events & fundraising, such as the Blind Dinner Date (BDD), Drive for Vision (DFV). The BDD netted \$1,889 and the DFV netted \$13,837. We allocate the proceeds from these events to The Association for the Blind & Vision Impaired, Cherry Street Eye Center and the GR Community Foundation.

We have funds held at Grand Rapids Community Foundation. The balance at June 30, 2024 was \$1,222,006.. These funds allow us to make grants to numerous charities. The total amount of donations the GR Lions made for the year from fund-raisers plus the foundation dollars was \$69.781
